## 4-H Animal Ownership Dates

The following table identifies the latest date that ownership must be established for animals to be used in 4-H animal science project exhibitions. Some counties may establish earlier ownership deadlines.

For the purposes of 4-H project exhibitions, an animal must be owned or leased by a single 4-H member. The exception to this is with performance animals, including horses, camelids, and dogs, which may be leased by up to two 4-H members as outlined in the Maryland 4-H Performance Animal Lease Guidelines.

Animals that are to be leased for the purpose of 4-H project work must be identified on the Maryland 4-H Animal Lease Guidelines and submitted to the County 4-H Office by June 1<sup>st</sup>. If a 4-Her exhibits a leased animal at a Spring Show, the registration form must be completed and turned in to the County/City 4-H Office by May 1<sup>st</sup>. A copy of the completed Lease Documents will be sent to the State 4-H Office by the County/City 4-H office to be placed on file. Some counties may establish earlier deadlines.
