Small Acreage Forester Survey Report

October 13, 2016

Survey was sent out September 27, 2016 to 21 emails representing the foresters in the directory. A reminder was sent out September 30, and October 10, 2016. Of the 21 surveys all but one was completed, due to a bad email address. This represents a 100% return.

Message provided with survey:

The University of Maryland Extension (UME) created the Maryland Small-Acreage Professional Forester Directory in 2012 to encourage small-acreage landowners to seek professional assistance. The publication is available at: http://www.extension.umd.edu/learn/small-acreage-foresters-directory-0

State foresters do not typically provide services with landowners less than 10 acres and this voluntary directory was a resource that could be provided to landowners that attended workshops or visited the UME Woodland Stewardship Education website (www.extension.umd.edu/woodland).

Q2: Have you received contacts from clientele who located you using the directory?

- 37% (7) Yes

Q6: How many acres of land were affect by activities you implemented?

- 31% (4) None
- 8% (1) 2-4 acres
- 8% (1) 4-6 acres
- 54% (7) 10 acres or more

Q7: What can the University of MD do to better promote your services to small acreage landowners?

- A statement that some activities such as timber sales may not be feasible might help. That may be on there already I haven't checked the site completely.
- Try to educate them on the positive note of using a professional forester.
- Better manage expectations with landowners who own land less than ten acres.
- continue to provide the list
- Try reaching out to non-traditional forest owners, maybe large lot commercial properties. Agricultural use will apply to commercial properties the same as residential, tax savings will likely be much more. Try working with real estate companies, those that may purchase or sell smaller acreages. They may have professional development forums I would like to hear about them and would volunteer to speak at them. Try communicating the message of what is expected with a forest plan. Many folks probably

assume you have to commercially harvest trees which may turn them off. If they know commercial harvesting is not a requirement, they may be more open to a formal plan.

• 94% (15) yes

Q9: Please share any comments? Ideas on how to better market the directory would be appreciated.
