### **Horticulture Judging**

Frederick County 4-H members were well represented at the Maryland State Horticulture Judging Contest on September 3. The contest consisted of identifying flowers, vegetables and herbs, fruits and nuts, ornamentals (trees, shrubs, vines), and pests (pests, weeds, and diseases) and 8 quality judging classes. The senior contestants also had a written exam consisting of 40 questions. The contest is based on the National Junior Horticulture Association identification lists.

In the junior division, the team placed first. Individually, **Penny C.** placed 3rd in Flowers, 1st in Ornamentals, 2nd in Vegetables, 1st in Fruit, 3rd in Pests and 1st Overall. **Desmond G.** placed 2nd in Flowers, 4th in Ornamentals, 1st in Vegetables, 3rd in Fruit, 1st in Pests and 2nd Overall. **Emma F.** placed 1st in Flowers, 2nd in Ornamentals, 6th in Vegetables, 4th in Fruit, 4th in Pests and 3rd Overall. **Abigail S.** placed 5th in Flowers, 7th in Ornamentals, 8th in Vegetables, 6th in Fruit, 4th in Pests and 5th Overall.

In the intermediate division, **Bobear A**. placed 5th in Flowers, 4th in Ornamentals, 4th in Vegetables, 4th in Fruit, 6th in Pests and 4th Overall.

In the senior division, the team placed first. Individually, **Kira A.** placed 1st in Flowers, 2nd in Ornamentals, 1st in Vegetables, 2nd in Fruit, 1st in Pests, 1st in Test and 1st Overall. **Kendall C.** placed 2nd in Flowers, 5th in Ornamentals, 3rd in Vegetables, 6th in Fruit, 4th in Pests, 7th in Test and 4th Overall. **Liam G.** placed 6th in Flowers, 4th in Ornamentals, 4th in Vegetables, 3rd in Fruit, 8th in Pests, 3rd in Test and 5th Overall. **Joni E.** placed 8th in Flowers, 6th in Ornamentals, 10th in Vegetables, 7th in Fruit, 5th in Pests, 8th in Test and 7th Overall.

**Kira A.** and **Liam G.** were on the Maryland State team representing Maryland at the National Contest that was held in Towson, Maryland October 7th-10th in conjunction with the National Junior Horticulture Association Convention.

**Kira A.** placed 1st individually and only missed 6 out of 100 identification specimens!! The Maryland team placed 2nd Overall.

Members met every Tuesday during the summer for practice at the Extension Office. Members were coached by **Myrtle Sturtz**, 4-H Volunteer, **Susan Trice**, Extension Principal Associate Agent for the University of Maryland, and **Ashley Conlan**, Master Gardener.


### **Maryland State Poultry & Egg Judging Results**





After you complete your enrollment in 4-HOnline, you will receive an email from Kim Krasauskis with the following steps for completing your 4-H Volunteer On Boarding:

- ♦ 1. Background Check: Once you complete your 4-HOnline enrollment (#2 above), the Maryland 4-H office will send you an invitation email around the 1st or 15th of the month (depending on when you submitted your enrollment) through vendor Sterling Volunteers. THIS MUST BE COMPLETED WITHIN 30 DAYS OF RECEIVING THE INITIAL EMAIL FROM TheAdvocates@sterlingvolunteer.com or you will be DISMISSED by Maryland 4-H for one year and unable to volunteer with 4-H until completing the onboarding in 2024.
- ♦ **2. References:** An *Adobe Sign* email will be sent to your 3 references listed in your 4-HOnline Screening, so they can complete the reference form digitally. Please let them know in advance so they can watch for the email coming from <a href="kkrasaus@umd.edu">kkrasaus@umd.edu</a>.
- ♦ **3. Volunteer Orientation Training -Please watch <u>this 4-H Volunteer Orientation Video</u> and then complete the Orientation Survey. I will automatically receive a notification of your completion of the 4-H Volunteer Orientation Training Survey.**
- ♦ **4. Phone Interview** To select a sign up time please go to: <a href="https://calendly.com/erkline/4-h-volunteer-phone-interview">https://calendly.com/erkline/4-h-volunteer-phone-interview</a>
- ♦ **5.** Signing an **Appointment Agreement and Position Description** via an Adobe Sign email that will be sent to you after Steps 1-4 are completed.
- \*\* A 4-H Volunteer cannot work with 4-H Youth until ALL the above steps are completed and the 4-HOnline record is approved by both the State office and our local Frederick County office. The volunteer will receive a welcome email after all steps and approvals are completed and they are cleared to work with 4-H youth.




#### Scholarships:

### Frederick 4-H Naturalists

On a beautiful day in mid July the Frederick 4H Naturalist club did our first annual field trip to Maryland's

with the Chesapeake Bay Environmental Center (CBEC) staff on a tour around a nearby Bay called Marshy Creek. The mission of the CBEC is to connect people to nature through adventure based learning, and so our tour led us out into the bay where we saw great stands of an invasive grass called Phragmites (Common Reed) that covers all of the marshland around. It grows very tall and dense so that native shoreplants and other organisms don't have room to survive and thrive. In the water we caught sight of jellyfish and some terrapins! We passed by an osprey nest and then saw its inhabitant carry a large fish in its talons



back to the nest.

On the water, out in the distance we could see a tree with branches that supported a nest 6 feet in diameter that Bald Eagles have used for years! We were told that it could hold the weight of two people! We also learned about the importance of subaquatic vegetation (SAV) for filtering out sediments and nutrients and keeping the bay water clear to help the sea grasses get sunlight and keep oysters from being covered with sediment. Everyone is enthusiastic to return in the fall to see what has changed!
